

Thank you for registering for TOSRV. This year TOSRV is just one of many cycling events that make up the new **Big Bend Cycling Festival**.

If you are coming in on Friday night you have the opportunity to get your bike blessed in the Railroad Square Art Park. The Art Park celebrates everything art related on the first Friday of every month. They are located off Railroad Ave, just south of Gaines St. A Film Festival will also be there, hosted by Tallahassee's only cooperative bike shop, Krank it Up. We'll be showing some great bike related flicks in a fun outdoor setting. Don't miss this opportunity to do something other than sit in your hotel room the night before TOSRV.

Packet Pickup and Registration

Friday, April 4th: From 10-6pm at Higher Ground bike shop at 3185 Capital Circle NE (Across from Home Depot). 850-562-BIKE.

Saturday, April 5th: From 7am – 8am at Calhoun and Park Avenue. This is also the ride starting location. **PARKING IS 5 BLOCKS AWAY FROM THE RIDE START**. Please see this website for parking maps: www.cccyclists.org

Sunday, April 6th: From 7-8am at Quincy Recreation Center on Graves Street. See www.cccyclists.org for parking maps.

Day One, Saturday, April 5th

Day of Registration: 7-8am

Ride Start: 8am.

Parking: Downtown Tallahassee at the headquarters of the FL Lottery located at 250 Marriot Drive. You will have to ride your bike 5 blocks west to get to the TOSRV start. Please go to this website for maps: www.cccyclists.org

Day 1 Route: Rolling hills for approximately the first 45 miles, then almost perfectly flat until a mile from the end. Downtown Tallahassee is a hilly area, so the last mile is not flat. TOSRV ends a few blocks from where it started. Massage tables will be there for those that would like to pay for that service. An after-ride spaghetti dinner will be located nearby at the Double Tree Hotel at their banquet hall from 1-5pm.

Day Two, Sunday, April 6th

Day of Registration: 7-8am

Ride Start: on Sunday, April 6th is at 8am for Century riders; 8:30 for Metric riders.

Parking for Day Two in Quincy is at the Quincy Recreation Center on Graves St.

Day 2 Route: Very hilly throughout! For century riders the route flattens out only in the last 10 miles; for the metric riders the only flat area is the first ten miles. Massage tables will be set up at the Recreation Center when you return to Quincy. This Sunday massage service is provided by TOSRV, but gratuity tips are appreciated. Cake and ice cream follows.

Other events going on at the Big Bend Cycling Festival:

All day Atomic Crit races will be going on downtown along a 3 block course simultaneously with TOSRV. You will likely miss the beginner women, men, and junior races, but after the spaghetti dinner at the Double Tree you can watch:

- 6pm Women Pro 1-3 racers
- 7pm Dignitary lap of many Big Bend mayors, county chairmen, and sheriffs
- 7:30 pm, Mens Pro 1-2 racers

There are many bars from which to watch these events. Some have out door seating!

Bike Parts Swap Meet is hosted by bikechain.com and *Krank it Up*. We will set up tables and racks on the crit race course so folks can bring their unwanted bike parts and accessories and buy/sell/trade/ donate them. The crit course is just a few blocks away from the TOSRV starting place, so after your ride on Saturday you can watch some races and sell or buy parts. Hours of operation are 3-6pm.

- Display your custom bikes and frames
- Donate unwanted parts
